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## General information

### Class Policy and Procedure

Students are responsible to obtain the material of the classes missed and to stay up to date. During this course you will take short exams, according to the academic calendar. The fact that you did not study for said exam, will not be a valid reason not to take it on the day scheduled.

### Important information on Book Reports and Class Projects

For very important things, you should consider while writing your reports and projects:

1. **Each report must contain the following:**

- **Name of student**
- **Date**
- **Name of course**
- **Description of report:** Every report (class and book report) must start with the description of the report as stated in the syllabus. This text is clearly indicated (highlighted in color and bold within borders) in each subject and each report in this syllabus. **Please copy this text as the start of every report.**

2. Reports need to be named clearly using the following format – yyyy-mm-dd/initials of student/course/name of report (for example 2019-09-14 EV Inner healing book). All reports need to be in Word or Pdf format. Completed reports need to be emailed to [admin@pli.am](mailto:admin@pli.am).

3. **Presentation:** Remember that everything what we do must be done as if it were for the Lord. The Work must be neat, presentable. **All material by computer must be in Times New Roman font, and font size must be 12pt, with margins kept no less than 1,5 cm.**

4. **Content:** This implies that it must be specific to what is requested. The work turned in must be your own and not done in a group effort.

**Book reports** should focus on how the book impacted and changed your way of thinking – how are you implementing now what you learned from the book and what are the effects thereof. This should **not** be a report that only summarizes the book.

5. **Creativity:** God created you as an original, so do not conform to being a copy, be yourself. Ask the Holy Spirit to aid you and see what amazing ideas He will give you to complete your projects and reports. It is not acceptable to copy material obtained in the internet and make it seem like it is your own work. You may gather and collect small portions that will enrich your report but be sure to use quotations and give credit to the original writer in the bibliography section of your report.

6. **Bibliography:** All material that is not your own (Ex. Illustrations, photos, quoted material) should be identified in its text appropriately. Furthermore, a bibliography page should be added in the back of your report and such things should be included there.

### **Important information on exams**

All mentioned dates for exams and reports are fixed. Only in extreme circumstances will allowances be made to deviate from them. This will be done on a case-by-case basis. Students that want to apply for this allowance need to send their request to [admin@pli.am](mailto:admin@pli.am). The request must contain clear reasons why the student is applying for an extension to the date and must be sent at least 1 week before the due date. Online students will receive their exam instructions by mail and complete the exam online on the assigned day.

## Revealed Theology I (TEOR 201)

(Initials of course: RT1)

### Course Description

Basic introduction to theology and in particular to the knowledge of God and his attributes. This course will cover qualities of God and how we should relate to Him based on these qualities. You will be taught about the glory of God, the omnipresence and omnipotence of God. The topics of Jesus' work, our relationship with the Holy Spirit, and the fear of God will also be covered.

### Course Objective

- Help the student develop a closer relationship with God by knowing Him more
- To know God better through the revelation of His names
- Know the attributes of God and their implications.
- Have theological knowledge of the work of Jesus.

### Class Project or Laboratory

Please copy the following text as start to your report:

**Do an investigation of theologians in the history of the church, choose one and write a report of their life and theological positions. You can turn to theology books, encyclopedias or dictionaries.**

This project should be typed on a computer or typewriter and be a minimum of two complete pages. This is in order to evaluate the student in the practical area. The report can be written in English or Dutch. **This report is worth 20% of your grade.**

## Old Testament I (BIBL 101)

(Initials of course: OT1)

### Course Description

In this course we will notice how throughout the Old Testament, the way is prepared for Christ, predicting it in typology and in prophecy. We will study about the Pentateuch which is composed of the first five books of the Bible written by Moses. We will also have the opportunity to take a walk-through history as revealed through the Holy Spirit to its writers giving certainty and affirming the responsibility of his fatherhood through the Divine inspiration in each of narrated and prophesied events.

## Course Objective

May this class inspire students to want to know:

- Each book of the Old Testament that their faith be enriched through the different events narrated from creation,
- How sin entered the world,
- The exodus of the people of Israel,
- The different kingdoms and their kings,
- The law and the prophets and the similarity that exists with us as the spiritual Israel that we are.

# New Wine Generation (PRCA 220)

(Initials of course: NWG)

## Course Description

In this course we will learn about Gods purpose for us to be a New Wine Generation.

## Course Objective

- To learn about the need of the restoration of all things according to God's original intention.
- Identify the influence of the spirit of Greece
- To know about the apostolic reform; know the characteristics, functions and duties of the apostle
- To learn the characteristics of an apostolic church, and of the generation of New Wine that walks in the supernatural

## Revealed Theology II (TEOR 202)

(Initials of course: RT2)

### Course Description

This class is the second part of a basic introduction to theology. The class is complementary to Revealed Theology I, covering additional topics such as the exclusivity of Christianity, anthropology, angels and the Kingdom of God.

### Course Objectives:

Give the student the knowledge that every disciple of Christ must have in the basic areas of Theology

### Course Requirements

## Old Testament II (BIBL 102)

(Initials of course: OT2)

### Course Description

In this second part of the study of the Old Testament, we will study the 5 poetic books as well as enter into the Minor Prophets and the Major Prophets included in 17 books ranging from Isaiah to Malachi, some of which brought messages of judgment, others that infused comfort and hope, some called to repentance with the messianic message of Jesus Christ.

### Course Objective

Among others we want the student to learn about:

- The why of the suffering of the righteous.
- The depth of prayer and praise.
- Where to find moral and spiritual instruction.
- The sanctity of marital love.
- The different ways God spoke to his people through prophecy.

### Course Requirements

## **New Testament (BIBL 110)**

(Initials of course: NT)

### **Course Description**

In this course we will study topics related to the fatherhood of God and his reflection in the church of This course is a panoramic and systematic study of the New Testament (NT). The student will be imparted knowledge about the life of Christ, the authors of the NT books, the establishment of the early church, understanding of the main ideas of the gospels, historical books and general epistles. This class will also cover the life of the apostle Paul and the epistles written by the Apostle from Romans to Philemon.

### **Course Objective**

Upon completion of the course, the student will have knowledge about:

- The political and historical background of Palestine in the first century.
- The world political and historical background of the inter-testamentary period.
- The Jewish groups of the time of Jesus.
- The synoptic gospels.
- Jesus in the gospels.
- The Johannine Epistles
- Have a knowledge of the life of the apostle Paul
- Have a basic knowledge of each of their epistles, the doctrines main Christianity through the epistles and how they affect the church today.
- Have knowledge about the missionary journeys of the apostle.

(Initials of course: IFFM)

## Course Description

In this course we will learn about the purpose of the Five-Fold ministry.

It also includes the world empires, the end times, the rapture of the Church, the great tribulation, the antichrist, the millennium and the resurrection of the dead.

## Course Objective

For the student to learn:

- The chronology of times
- Interpretation of the prophecy of the seventy weeks in Daniel
- The events of the end

# Intercession and Spiritual Warfare (PRCA 140)

(Initials of course: ISW)

## Course Description

Throughout this class, the student will understand the true purpose of intercession and the importance of having a physical body. Additionally, students will have the opportunity to understand the different effects that these factors have in the spiritual realm, encouraging the student to intercede so that the things that we establish in the spiritual may also be established in the natural.

This is an advanced course on intercession and spiritual warfare. We will examine the concepts, elements, conditions and results of spiritual warfare, using the tools that the Scriptures provide to the believer.

## Course Objective

- Learn and understand what intercession is and what is its purpose.
- Learn to intercede effectively.
- Appropriate and exercise the power to bind and to loosen.
- Understand and apply the most detailed processes of spiritual warfare.
- Implement and carry out successful spiritual battles.
- Protect yourself and others adequately when carrying out spiritual warfare.
